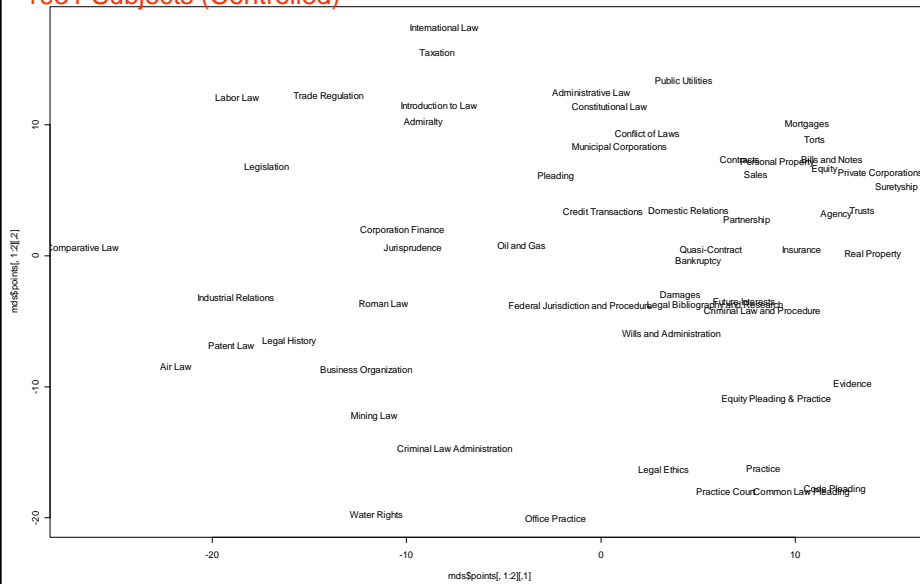

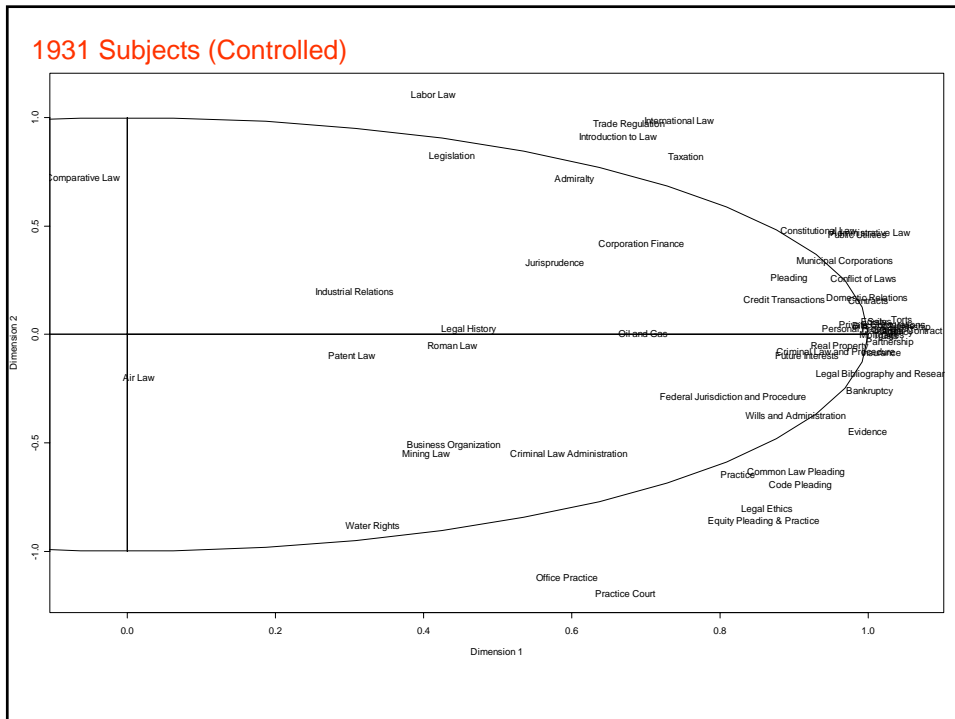
MDS (Multidimensional Scaling)
